PARTNERSHIP NEWS:



This month's Partnership meeting took place on Wednesday, 19th October, 2016 at 6.30 p.m. in the Community Centre.

The chairperson of the meeting, Linda PEARS, welcomed everyone and gave a short resume of the life of Bill STOCKDALE, one of the founding members of the partnership, who passed away on 28th September. Bill was instrumental in the setting up of many things in Leadgate, i.e. Leadgate Historical Society and the doctors' surgery, he also taught in Leadgate and played cricket for Cricket Club. He leaves a remarkable legacy. A minutes silence was then held.

At last month's meeting mention was made that white at Pont Bungalows had not been painted and to date the situation is still the same.

The question of Public Liability Insurance was discussed and further enquiries are to be made to obtain estimates. Questions had been asked about 'Bridge House' but no information is available.

The meeting was informed if you become a member of the Co-op you earn 5% and a further 1% goes to the community. This applies to the Co-op's branded goods and services, i.e. food, funeral care, legal services, electrical and insurance – the Co-op is working to introduce the 5% and 1% on home and car insurance in the future. It only cost £1 to become a member: the card has to be registered on line at coop.co.uk/register or by telephoning 0800 023 4708. If you want to help your community, why not become a member.

A Project Plan entitled 'Our Wonderful Watling Wood' completed by one of the Partnership's newest members, Mr. David LAVERY, was submitted and a lengthy discussion concerning it followed. It was agreed a meeting between Tesco, Durham County Council, Groundwork and the Partnership be arranged as soon as possible and thereafter a committee be formed to co-ordinate the work to be carried out. This work will provide a boardwalk over particularly wet sections of footpath, the installation of a pond dipping platform, seating, add native marginal plants to the pond to enhance the habitat diversity and to create a small damp meadow area.

The next meeting will be Wednesday, 16th November, 2016 at 6.30 p.m. in the Community Centre.

POLICE NEWS:

The main issue in Leadgate at the moment appears to be youths congregating on the Front Street. The problems seem to include anti-social use of bikes and bad language. Youths have been identified and parents have been spoken to. The area is to remain a target for extra patrols to keep an eye on the issue.
